EHS Hornet Marching Band Brings Home 4 Trophies from Missouri

The EHS Hornet Marching Band, under the direction of Andy Richter, was awarded four trophies after performing at a state high school competition in Missouri. This occurred when the 250-member band was traveling on a tour of the Ozarks. The awards came from a marching performance in the Homecoming Parade at Missouri State University in Springfield. There were 34 bands and five classes. Edina was in the largest class. Awards were for Best Drum Major, First Place in Class, Best Overall Musical Sound and Best Overall Precision, among all 34 bands.

The four-day tour in October included another parade and band performance for the public at Branson Landing, a riverfront shopping and tourist destination. Musical numbers included favorites from the home field this past football season: "Fire" by Jimi Hendrix, "Let's Groove" by Earth, Wind & Fire, "Crazy Train" and "Sweet Caroline." In addition to performing, the band enjoyed side trips to see shows at Branson, an outdoor adventure at a zip line destination and a visit to an amusement park, Silver Dollar City.

"We are very proud of our students and how they represented Edina and Minnesota throughout the entire trip," said Richter. Also sharing in pride was Missouri State University alumna, Amanda Kremer, who is band director at Valley View Middle School in Edina.
